2021 Renewals Update and New Website


The new Board website launched in the past few weeks and we are excited to share some of the new features with you. If you haven't already, please go to <u>https://nvvetboard.nv.gov</u> and check out the new site. We have updated regulations that have been passed in the past few years, all previous bulletins and newsletters have been updated, as have past Board meeting minutes.

There is also a completely new portal for licensees.



On your first visit to the new site, you can scroll down to locate the link to the 'Licensee login' page. You will need to create an account on your first visit, but after that you will have access to many new and updated features, including:

Changing your place of practice Updating personal information Updating addresses On-demand wallet card printing Requesting letters of good standing Renewing licenses online Uploading and logging CE certificates Requesting name changes




There are also updated pages that have tons of information for questions that you, other practice staff, or the public may have. The FAQ page is a great resource for answers to most commonly asked questions.

2021 Renewals Update-Big Changes!

During the 2021 Legislative Session, a bill was passed that included changes to the renewal process for the Veterinary Board. After this year's renewal cycle, renewals will occur biannually and licenses will now expire on June 30 of every odd year. The intention of these changes is to make the renewal process easier and more efficient for you by having renewals occur less often and during a less busy time of year.



All current licenses expire on December 31, 2021.You will be able to renew your licenses beginning October 15, 2021. Once you complete your renewal this year, your license will be issued for 18 months. This means that all renewed licenses, regardless of type will expire June 30, 2023.

Fees will be increased by 1/2 of the cost of a regular renewal to account for the transition. CE hours will remain the same. After 2023, renewals will occur during odd years and licenses will be issued for 2 years. You may still renew by paper or online at https://nvvetboard.nv.gov, You will need to go to the licensee portal link and create an account in order to renew online. We have created an entirely new portal, so if you have any incorrect information showing on your portal, please let us know and we will fix any issues as soon as possible. You will also be able to obtain wallet cards on-demand through the portal.
